### Step 1

#### **Build an Academic Foundation**

Take academically challenging classes to develop an understanding of different subjects and a solid academic preparation for college-level courses.

Also, take classes to explore different careers. Try new things, you may discover something you love!

### Step 2

#### **Select classes to gain knowledge and skills**

Practice creative problem solving skills. Increase written and oral communication and teamwork skills. Learn to think critically, and become technology proficient.

Learn time management. Develop good study habits, and work on skills that will impress a future employer.

### Step 3

#### **Evaluate progress & revise your plan**

Do your best! Don't make choices now that will limit your choices when you graduate.

Don't be afraid to change your mind. Revise and update your 4-year plan as you go.

Take advantage of free testing and use the results to revise and make plans.

Meet regularly with your counselor to discuss options.
